

Why are we still poor then?

Your Excellency,

Ladies and Gentlemen!

Africa is poor because we still rely on things that have long been proven wrong.

We will remain poor if we continue to rely so heavily on commodity production and exports with minimal value addition...

... and with even fewer forward and backward linkages to other sectors of our African economies.

It is therefore my sincere hope that the inauguration of the Buyasso Coffee Factory today will prove to be an important step in helping policymakers to rethink how value addition can ensure durable wealth creation at individual and family level — as we hope this income generation initiative will do for the youth here in Bukoto Central and Greater Masaka Region.



I therefore call upon the management of this factory to make sure that the target group gets decent pay from their coffee through value addition that is well anchored in local content promotion for sustainable national development.

Dear Youths of Bukoto Central and Greater Masaka Region:

You are in the right market!

With at least a café on every corner in over 95% of all towns and cities around the globe, coffee is without doubt one of the top commodities worldwide.

As the *third most consumed beverage in the world* after water and tea, coffee beans are in high demand everywhere.

Second only to oil, *coffee is the world's second most traded commodity,* with about half a trillion cups consumed per year.

Uganda is the world's 8th largest producer of coffee, producing 288,000 metric tons per year. Bloomberg, one of the world's leading financial, software, data and media companies, expects Uganda to soon be among the "Top 5."

I therefore congratulate you, dear youths, for the achievement of this key milestone in a market that is a vital part of the Ugandan economy!

But please remember always that hard work and commitment to duty are the two critical success factors necessary for you to achieve the vision of this project.



With hard work and commitment, you will grow stronger and stand on your own feet. We expect you to do this so well that other youths can emulate you.

The fact that Uganda is the youngest nation of the world – with the majority of Ugandans15 years old or younger – makes this even more important.

While at it, please think of the environment by combining its pivotal aspects with commercial realism. This way you will be contributing to addressing the challenges of climate change which for example just this week again led to landslides that killed and displaced many of our people. This is not a challenge too big for any of us individually. Just take responsibility for your own role – be it no longer using *kaveera* or planting new trees [if you have to cut one] – and you will be making a huge contribution in the larger scheme of this global matter.
